Educational Diagnostician Certificate Requirements (TAC 239)

Requirements for admissions are as follows:

1. A baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution of higher education that at the time was accredited or otherwise approved by an accrediting organization recognized by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board;
2. A valid classroom teaching certificate; and
3. Meet the requirements for admission to an educator preparation program under Chapter 227.

Requirements for certification are as follows:

1. Successfully complete an educational diagnostician preparation program that meets the requirements of §239.82 and §239.83 (relating to Standards Required for the Educational Diagnostician Certificate);
2. Successfully complete the examination based on the standards identified in §239.83
3. Hold, at a minimum, a master's degree from an accredited institution of higher education that at the time was accredited or otherwise approved by an accrediting organization recognized by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board;
4. Hold a valid classroom teaching certificate; and
5. Have three creditable years of teaching experience as a classroom teacher, as defined in Chapter 153, Subchapter CC Texas Education Code, §5.001(2).

In order to take the state exam, a candidate must meet academic competency requirements and receive approval to test from Texas A&M-San Antonio (TAC §242.5).
