Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in educational programs and activities at schools that receive federal financial assistance. Title IX ensures program equity and forbids sexual harassment, sexual violence, sexual assault, domestic and dating violence, stalking, and discrimination based on sex or pregnancy and parental status.

Texas A&M University-San Antonio is committed to providing an educational environment and workplace free from discrimination and harassment based on sex.
