

GEOGRAPHY (GEOG)

GEOG 1301 Physical Geography Meteorology

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

This course provides and introduction to the processes involved in the formation of the Earth's physical environment. Emphasis is on the general studies of flora, fauna, weather, climate, vegetation, soils, and landforms. A focus on meteorology will be integral to the course.

Restrictions: Enrollment is limited to Undergraduate level students.

GEOG 1302 Cultural Geography

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

A survey of the cultural diversity found on earth. Topics include population, language, religion, ethnicity, and popular culture, with a special focus on spatial attributes and expressions of culture.

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

GEOG 1303 World Geography

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Study of major world regions with emphasis on prevailing conditions and developments, including emerging conditions and trends, and the awareness of diversity of ideas and practices found in those regions. Course content may include one or more regions.

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

GEOG 2390 Selected Topics: Geography

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

A course in geography in areas of specialization of the faculty, with emphasis on current developments. Specific topics will be changed from semester to semester, so a student may take the course for credit more than once. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: permission of the instructor.

Restrictions: Enrollment is limited to Undergraduate level students.

Repeat Status: Course may be repeated 1 time(s).

GEOG 3305 Environmental Geography

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

The nature, geographic distribution, use and misuse of global resources with emphasis on those of North America. Ecosystems, air, water, soil, mineral and energy resources will be considered. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: 3 semester credit hours of Geography or a science course (see General Education Requirements Natural sciences component).

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

GEOG 3331 United States and Canada

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

The regional aspects of landforms, climate, resources and peoples of United States and Canada. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: 12 semester hours of social sciences.

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

GEOG 4390 Advanced Topics: Geography

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

A course in geography in areas of specialization of the faculty, with emphasis on current developments. Specific topics will be changed from semester to semester, so a student may take the course for credit more than once. (Maximum 6 hours). TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: Permission of the instructor.
